

COMPLIANCE QUIZ: True or False?

1. A Pirate Club member may provide home-cooked meals daily to student-athletes.
2. During a prospects official visit to East Carolina University's campus, representatives of ECU's athletics interests may not be involved in any way in the recruitment of the prospect.
3. It is permissible for booster club members to write prospects on one occasion to tell them about the athletics program at ECU.
4. Once an individual is identified as a representative of athletics interests, he/she retains that identity indefinitely.
5. After a prospect has signed a National Letter of Intent, representatives of athletics interest may telephone the prospect once per week.
6. Reduced housing costs may not be provided to student-athletes, unless the same rate is made available and provided to all students.
7. In general, a prospective student-athlete is a student-athlete who has started classes for ninth grade.
8. The Athletics Department may donate items for auctions at local high schools to support the respective athletics programs provided the request is made by a Pirate Club member.
9. Complimentary admissions for home athletics events for prospects may be provided via a pass list.
10. There are no restrictions relative to currently enrolled student-athletes telephoning prospects.

1. FALSE. Such meals may be provided on infrequent and special occasions, not daily.
2. TRUE
3. FALSE: Booster Club members are prohibited from sending correspondence to prospect (NCAA Bylaw 13.1.2.1)
4. TRUE: NCAA Bylaw 13.02.13.1
5. FALSE: Representatives are prohibited from making telephone calls to prospects (NCAA Bylaw 13.1.3.5.1); however, the representative may speak to the prospect via the telephone if the prospect initiates the call and the call is not for recruiting purposes. The representative must then refer questions about the athletics program to athletics department staff (NCAA Bylaw 13.1.3.5.1.1)
6. TRUE
7. TRUE: NCAA Bylaw 13.02.11
8. FALSE: An institution may not provide funding, directly or through paid advertisements, to benefit a high school athletics program (NCAA Bylaw 13.15.1.2). A representative of athletics interests (Pirate Club member) may provide funding to benefit a high school athletics program located in the community in which the athletics representative reside provided the rep. acts independently of ECU, the funds are distributed through channels established by the high school or the organization conducting the fund-raising activity, and the funds are not earmarked directly for a specific prospect (NCAA Bylaw 13.15.1.2.1)
9. TRUE: NCAA Bylaw 13.6.6.2
10. FALSE: Enrolled student-athletes or other enrolled students shall not make or participate in telephone calls to prospective student-athletes at the direction of a coaching staff member or financed by the institution or a representative of its athletics interests; however, they may receive telephone calls at the expense of the prospective student-athlete subsequent to July 1 following the

completion of the prospective student-athlete's junior year in high school (NCAA Bylaw 13.1.3.5.2)
